House Bill 2489 proposes to amend 47 O.S. § 1135.5 creating a special license plate for any person wishing to support Beller Foundation. The annual fee for the plate shall be \$35 and shall be in addition to all other annual motor vehicle registration fees. The bill provides that \$20 of the fee amount may be used for entering into any required licensing agreement for use of the foundation's logo or design. The special license plate shall be designed in consultation with the administration of Beller Foundation.

The proposed — if necessary — \$20 licensing agreement payment amount to Beller Foundation for possible use of the foundation's logo or design on each such special license plate issued would result in a corresponding \$8 deposit to the OTC Reimbursement Fund and a \$7 deposit for apportionment as motor vehicle collections. Any estimated revenue impact will be minimal (positive in nature).
