The proposal strikes the Oklahoma residency requirement and expands the purpose presently authorized to include, but not be limited to, the production of historical documents, displays, videos, and books that capture the National Guard's involvement in overseas deployments and domestic operations within the United States for members of the Oklahoma National Guard, Oklahoma public school libraries, and civic leaders, as determined by the Adjutant General.
