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FOR THE COMMISSION

SB 1136 proposes a new law which allows the Legislature the ability to disapprove any federal rule or regulation which may affect a state agency.

The measure proposes to create a new law which provides that upon receipt by a state agency of a requirement for an agency to adopt, follow or otherwise submit to any new federal rule or regulation or change to an existing federal rule or relation, or interpretation of any rule or regulation, that agency shall send the federal rule or regulation by electronic mail to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the Governor. By the adoption of a joint resolution, the Legislature may disapprove implementation by a state agency of any federal rule or regulation imposed on a state agency. Upon enactment of any joint resolution disapproving implementation of a rule or regulation, the agency shall file notice of such legislative disapproval with the Oklahoma Attorney General. The Governor may veto the joint resolution.
