**PROPOSAL:** Amendatory and New Law

The Committee Substitute for HB 3208 proposes to amend 63 O.S. § 427.3 to authorize the Oklahoma Medical Marijuana Authority to declare and establish a moratorium on processing and issuing new medical marijuana business licenses for an amount of time the Authority deems necessary. Beginning August 1, 2022, and ending August 1, 2024, the Authority will declare and establish a moratorium on processing and issuing new medical marijuana business licenses for dispensaries, processors and commercial growers, based on the number of current medical marijuana business licenses. The Executive Director of the Authority is authorized to terminate the moratorium at any time prior to August 1, 2024, if the Executive Director determines that all pending licensing reviews, inspections or investigations have been completed by the Authority.

## ATTACHMENT TO REVENUE IMPACT – HB 3208 [CS] Prepared 3/4/2022

The Committee Substitute for HB 3208 proposes to amend 63 O.S. § 427.3 to authorize the Oklahoma Medical Marijuana Authority to declare and establish a moratorium on processing and issuing new medical marijuana business licenses for an amount of time the Authority deems necessary. Beginning August 1, 2022, and ending August 1, 2024, the Authority will declare and establish a moratorium on processing and issuing new medical marijuana business licenses for dispensaries, processors and commercial growers, based on the number of current medical marijuana business licenses. The Executive Director of the Authority is authorized to terminate the moratorium at any time prior to August 1, 2024, if the Executive Director determines that all pending licensing reviews, inspections or investigations have been completed by the Authority.

The moratorium will not apply to the renewal of a medical marijuana business license for a dispensary, processor, or commercial grower, or to the issuance of a medical marijuana business license necessitated by a change in the ownership or location of a medical marijuana dispensary, medical marijuana processor, or medical marijuana commercial grower, provided the Authority is authorized to deny the request for issuance of a medical marijuana business license due to a change in ownership if the licensee is subject to any disciplinary action that may necessitate the revocation, suspension, or nonrenewal of the medical marijuana business license.

The Authority will review and process applications for medical marijuana business licenses for dispensaries, processors, and commercial growers, if applications were received on or before August 1, 2022.

HB 3208 will not impact collections attributable to retail sales of medical marijuana.
