ESTIMATED REVENUE IMPACT:

FY26: Decrease in individual income tax collections of \$11.983 million.

FY27: Decrease in individual income tax collections of \$30.064 million.

ANALYSIS: HB 1207 proposes to amend 68 O.S. § 2355, providing for a zero percent income tax rate on the two bottom tax brackets effective for tax year 2026 and subsequent tax years. The effects of this proposal were estimated using the Oklahoma Individual Income Tax Microsimulation Model. The chart below shows the estimated impact by tax and fiscal year.
